Marking

- Homework gives children another opportunity to review class learning.
- Homework gives parents an opportunity to see what is being learnt in school and support their children to reinforce the learning at home.
- Homework will not be marked by teachers. Teachers mark the children's work they undertake within their lessons daily to inform the next day's learning.

Spelling

- Children within the RWI Phonics programme record their learnt spelling words daily.
- Children who are not within the RWI Phonics programme apply their learnt subject related spellings/ vocabulary within the written work they undertake daily.
- Children within Y3/Y4/Y5 or Y6 may, on occasion, be provided with spelling rule homework.
- Children across the school may, on occasion, be provided with some additional homework related to learning taking place in the classroom.
